


What other subjects do you study with Geography and how well do they link?


Maths makes all the practical elements and statistical tests in Geography really easy for me., especially in the coursework.

“It’s a challenging subject which is demanding at times but it’s definitely worth it.”


89% of all students felt that A level Geography would be useful to them in the future life

“I have developed my academic and essay writing, presentations skills, independent research methods and skills”


“Reasoning, essay writing skills, thinking laterally are skills I have developed”

Even though many students had not chosen to study Geography at University 60% of students who completed the survey felt that Geography was in some way linked to their future. For example:

- Engineering – with a desire to focus on renewable energy or flood defences.
- Teaching – both primary and secondary
- International Development
- Working abroad e.g. Tourism
- Medicine – “Geography helped me understand the spread of commonly known diseases and the development of new ones can be linked to globalisation, migration patterns and increased trade.”
- Law – “World issues and topics like powers and borders link to international law modules I’m planning on doing and it also links to environmental law and human rights related modules at university.”
