4. Review Corporation composition	Committee reviewed current Corporation composition document, previously circulated, whilst considering succession & recruitment planning:  1. AHU was ratified at Corporation 15/5/23 as External Governor (Business).  JHO term of office ends December 2023. He is eligible for another term; the committee recommended his term be extended. RAR will speak to him about this. KSH (currently on sabbatical) term as parent governor ends December 2023. RAR will contact him to ask if he wants to stay on for another term as an external governor.  CSH currently in his second term as governor will shortly be stepping down, RAR will speak to him to ask if he will continue until the Corporation meeting on 2/10/23.  2. A candidate will be interviewed for the vacancy of External Governor (LA) on 13/6/23.  3. A potential new external governor was interviewed 22/5/23.  Confidential details of this candidate have been removed from these minutes.  AJO and the interview panel recommend that he is asked to join the Corporation.	RAR RAR

RAR added that he could also be a suitable candidate for the Conway Education Trust if the free school is approved. RAR agreed to speak to him to ascertain which organisation he wants to join.  4. CLA asked about the level of interest from parents in the past, RAR said that ballots have previously been held and unsuccessful candidates are often approached to become external governors. HRO has agree to take on the Lead Governor role for Mental Health.         There is a vacancy for Lead Governor for Safeguarding and Prevent, this will be explored with the candidate from the LA in their governor interview. RAR has amended the question about links with local businesses, to include examples, because the 2022 responses showed this as one of our weakest areas. Following CLA's question about how you define 'local' business, it was agreed the word local will be removed.</li> <li>2. 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6. Draft Governor Self-Assessment 2023	<ol> <li>Members considered the draft Governor Self-Assessment 2023, previously circulated.</li> <li>RAR amended the instructions to governors saying that new governors who haven't experienced many meetings yet do not have to complete it or can restrict their answers to the parts they feel comfortable with.</li> <li>JWA asked about improving the questions around how the board performs.         AJO suggested keeping it the same this year and including the document in the External Governance Review and ask them for recommendations of how to approach this.     </li> <li>CLA said it's easier to compare year-on-year if the structure and questions remain the same.</li> </ol>	RAR/Clerk
7. Governors Meeting Attendance, Term 1&2 2022/23	<ul> <li>Members considered the Governors meeting Attendance, Term 1&amp;2 2022/23, previously circulated.</li> <li>1. The document will be updated at the end of the academic year and will come back to S&amp;G (6/11/23) when the full year's attendance figures will be available.</li> <li>2. RAR said the figures will be used as a benchmark, governors will be reminded of the expected standards, and this will be used as a measurement to have conversations with governors if necessary.</li> <li>3. Clerk to make the spreadsheet easier to read with colour coding etc.</li> </ul>	Clerk
8. External Governance Review	<ol> <li>External Governance Review, paper previously circulated.</li> <li>This is a new mandatory requirement following government legislation. It has to be an independent external review which will probably cost between £5000-£10,000. Once complete it is made available and published on the college website.</li> <li>We can ask them to complete a bespoke review.</li> <li>Stone King is one of the companies that have been undertaking the reviews, they subcontract the work to governance professionals, review the findings and ensure the legislation is correct.</li> <li>Some of the other organisations in this field have an audit background.</li> <li>AJO has experience of similar audits in her job, she recommends spending time working out the brief of what you want them to look at otherwise it's a standard review which isn't value for money.</li> <li>RAR will draft a specification, AJO will review the document and it will go to Corporation for approval. It will then go out to chosen organisations to quote for the work and add their input.</li> </ol>	RAR/AJO Clerk for agenda

	6. JWO said when he was a governor at a school they had a similar governance review, they chose a judgement review which was divisive and became disruptive to the governing body, he does not recommend this option for our review.
