Border Force Officer

Average salary (per annum) £22,000 – £42,000 depending on experience Typical hours (per week): 38-42 Shift work is common and up to 12 hours long

What is a Border Force Officer?

Officers are on the frontline for protecting the UK's borders. This involves protecting from a range of threats such as terrorism, smuggling, fraud, organized crime, human trafficking, illegal trade. You would usually be based within airports and seaports across the country.

What you will be doing in this role?

- Check passports and travel documents
- Question passengers about their reasons for visiting the UK
- Search people, luggage, cars, coaches and freight vehicles
- Enforce rules and regulations
- Arrange for illegal immigrants to be detained
- · Work closely with other law enforcement agencies
- Opportunities to specialize in areas such as counter terrorism, organized crime, modern slavery and human trafficking
- Have line management responsibilities

What to expect

You could be operating border controls in France, Belgium and the Netherlands as well as around the UK. You will usually wear a uniform. The job is physically demanding and may require you to work outdoors. The role can be challenging and highly pressurized at times.

Some of the skills required:

An eye for detail Analytical and problem solving skills

The ability to remain calm is stressful situations

What to do to get into this career

5 GCSEs and at least 2 A Levels

A degree IS NOT ESSENTIAL, but criminology, psychology, public services and law may be helpful.



SKILLS SHORTAGES ACROSS WEST YORKSHIRE

Local context (West Yorkshire Local Skills Improvement Plan)

- Our regions key sectors are defined as: Health and Social Care, Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing, Financial and Professional Services, Low Carbon, Digital and Technology, Creative Industries, Education, Construction, Transport and Logistics
- West Yorkshire has a business base of 95,000 private sector businesses, predominantly small and medium-sized
- A diverse geography with a population of over 2.3m. An employed workforce of 1.1m with employment growth across diverse manufacturing and service sectors.
- Apprenticeships grew by 9% in 2021/22.
- Skills demand coming from three main sectors Health and Social Care, Manufacturing and Business Administration and Support Services
- Manufacturing and financial services offer a higher-than-average representation in the economy.
- There has been a growth in the green economy skills primarily in STEM related roles including engineering, project management, electricians and specialists such as environmental scientists.
- Growth in all areas of business particularly investment analysts, advisers and project managers
- Employability skills include team working, taking initiative, being inquisitive, attendance, time-keeping, work ethic, for example.
