
#### Academic skills weekly top tip

This week we recommend trying the **memory palace technique**.

Memory palaces are an effective memorisation technique, shown to significantly improve recall of information. By using this technique, you may be able to encode information more quickly into your long-term memory in preparation for exams.

Picture yourself walking through an extremely familiar place. Each location serves as a hook, to which you visually connect whatever you want to remember. To recall the items, you must then mentally walk through the locations. It is a great technique for memorising dates, facts, names, and sequences.

Picture yourself at home and think of the front door to your house and associate one piece of information to that place then move on to a room and think of the next thing you want to memorise in this place, and so on. When you have done this, try testing yourself to see if your recall of the information has improved.



If you do certain routines in one room regularly, such as making a cup of tea in the kitchen, you could use this in the same way by associating information with each stage of the process. Think of locations you are familiar with, such as Greenhead College, a park, a shop, or your workplace and try to picture fun, oversized, or miniature images, as you will find silly ideas helps with recall too.
