

Forensic Collision Investigator

Forensic collision investigator | Explore careers | National Careers Service

Average salary (per annum) £20,000 - £40,000 depending on experience Typical hours (per week): 38-40 This could include on call and shift work

What is a Forensic Collision Investigator?

This role involves using science and engineering to investigate the causes of transport related incidents. You will be working on-site and in an office. This working environment can be emotionally demanding and will require you to give evidence to the investigation team or the Courts.

Some ideas of what you will be doing in this role?

- Attend the scene of fatal and life-threatening transport incidents usually road traffic collisions
- Examine vehicles and vehicle parts
- Create plans of the scene and make time and distance studies
- Check tachograph information
- · Get technical information from vehicle manufacturers
- Produce reports
- Attend court where applicable

Other information

- You will need to be over 18 and have a full driving licence
- With experience you could move into management
- Possible to work on a freelance or consultancy basis

Knowledge of court and government procedures

Excellent communication skills

The ability to work independently and in a team

5 WAYS TO BECOME WORK READY

5 ways to improve your work readiness (youthemployment.org.uk)

Planning your next steps after education can appear to be very daunting. For many, the world of work is a completely new environment, so here are some tips from Youth Employment UK to help you feel positive, confident and motivated about seeking and applying for employment.

1. Improve your time-keeping

Most jobs will have a set working day and arriving on time is one of the most valued skills you can develop. Start by establishing a routine that you follow every day. Set an alarm, keep a diary, manage your day, arrive early to lessons/appointments/meetings. Start to understand public transport timetables. If driving, plan your journey allowing for delays and finding a place to park. Arriving late can lead to you feeling anxious, worried and consequently often ineffective when you arrive. Colleagues will also start to think of you as unreliable and this will have an impact on your career and possible progression.

2. Improve your written & verbal communication skills

Expand your vocabulary by reading widely, learning a new word each day, widen your general knowledge, learn to write in a concise and productive way, perfect the art of writing formally and in a report format. Challenge yourself to start a conversation with someone new and become confident in hearing yourself speak; a professional discussion is different to a chat with friends

3. Continually strive to improve your qualifications and experience

Volunteering and work experience will help to expand your skills, work ethic and networks. Every experience will enhance your application and show your potential to employers. A willingness to learn new skills demonstrates that you are engaged and committed to your personal development.

4. Improve your body language

According to the <u>Journal of Neuroscience</u> 'it only take a tenth of a second to form an impression of a stranger from their face', you are aiming for that judgement to be positive! Dress appropriately, look engaged and approachable; ask yourself, "would I employ me?" Most careers involve working with colleagues and networking with clients; learning to be aware of your body language and facial expressions not only affects how others perceive you, but also how confident you feel about yourself.

5. Improve your story

Looking for work, attending interviews and talking about yourself doesn't always come naturally. The more experiences you have the easier it is to make your story engaging and relevant, therefore opening up a positive dialogue between you and your interviewer.
