



# Weekly message for Greenhead College students and parents/carers

Dear all,

We have been interviewing prospective students from our local schools recently. As ever, I have been impressed with the calibre of young people who wish to join the Greenhead community and I wish them well for their forthcoming mock exams and GCSEs.

I continue to be amazed by the high aspirations and interest shown in the wider world by our current and future students, and this point has been borne out in both the recent interviews for next year's students and in the fundraising work that has been taking place in College this week.

Here are this week's messages:

#### 'Peace and Humanity' initiative - Gaza fundraising

Recently, I was contacted by the student Executive Officers who are keen that in the light of world events and the number of escalating crises, we should further promote our core principles of being a safe space which cherishes human values of compassion and understanding.

This week, the Greenhead College Student Association (GCSA) embarked on its support for a range of charitable good causes around the themes of 'Peace and Humanity'. These will continue over the years and evolve across multiple year groups of students.

It is envisaged that these activities will focus on support for worthy causes, for example: humanitarian aid, the climate crisis, mental health awareness and public sexual harassment.

The first of these activities took place on Tuesday. Students raised funds from a bake sale for PIMA (Palestinian International Medical Aid), a UK registered charity which aims to support Palestinian refugees in Gaza and Lebanon (*pictures I-r, below, are Abdul Raffey, Aamir Shafi and Marjan Khatib*).



Students were also invited to add their signature to a letter, calling for peace, that will be sent to local MPs. (A total of 390 signatures were collected.)

I am very pleased to report that students raised a total of £2000 for PIMA, which is a superb achievement. Many thanks to all those who donated and to those who contributed baked goods.

Through this and future events, covering a range of causes around the themes of 'Peace and Humanity', students are playing their part in calling for a better world.

#### Women's History Month and International Women's Day

#### Mock exam results and subject monitoring


Can I remind **A2 students** that mock exam results will be released at **11.00 am** on **Thursday**, **14 March**. I hope you have achieved some really good results. However, if the results aren't quite what you were expecting, there'll still be time for you to turn things round and put things right.

The recent mocks were a stepping stone to your actual exams, so see them as progress on your flight path to big results this summer. The most important thing is to stay positive - you may not see the effects of this straight away, but it will make a real difference if you take time to reflect on what you next need to work on.

Following release of the mock results, subject monitoring for A2 students (<u>surnames A-K</u>) will be taking place in College on **Friday**, **15 March**. This particular monitoring session will be crucial for A2s, as teachers will be focusing on the results of the mocks with you and planning ahead for this summer's final exams.

#### Academic skills weekly top tip


According to Oakes & Griffin (2019), research into how students learn shows there is one quality that differentiates top-performing students from others: the courage and determination to spend time focusing on weaknesses. Based on this, we recommend The Leitner Box system. (A2 students will recall I explained this system in last month's assembly.)

The Leitner Box is an effective recall system. It is particularly useful when trying to learn a big topic with a lot of subject-specific terminology. Start by making a set of flashcards for a topic. The cards should be easy to read and clear with a question or key term on one side and the answer or definition on the other.

Next, create 4 boxes:

- Box 1 put cards in here for frequent practice. This is the information you are not remembering well it needs regular review and reading because you are making mistakes when you practice recalling it or don't know it at all. Around 40% of time should be spent on these cards. When you fully recall a card, move it to box 2.
- Box 2 about 30% of your time should be spent on these cards. It focuses on the information you have just moved from box 1 or that you still get confused about.
- Box 3 spend 20% of time here as you nearly always get this information correct when you trust yourself on it. You feel confident about this information. If you make mistakes put the cards back into box 2.
- Box 4 this starts with the lowest number of cards as it is the material you consider easy and you always get it right, so you only need to spend 10% of your time on this box. However, nothing leaves this box because you know it so well. You still check it every now and again and the number of cards should increase with practice and effort.

The Leitner Box system should help you stay focused on the challenging things that you keep forgetting and by doing this you can address your weaknesses and see real progress.
